### Warrant Arrests:

- You become aware of a warrant for a known offender. The warrant is for Aggravated Assault Causing Serious Bodily Injury. You know where this suspect lives. Describe your actions to arrest this offender.
- Remember, take every opportunity to slow down. Consider the issue: a known person has a warrant for a violent offense, and you are going to his house. He knows his house; you do not.
- This is clearly a Hold, but what does this Hold look like?
- First, involve others. Ask Dispatch for any known phone numbers for the suspect or the residence. Find out who all lives there, if possible. Get vehicle information.
- Search RMS for all recent cases.
- Call your supervisor and determine if you have the green light to pursue this arrest while working Patrol.
- Huddle...anyone who is involved needs to be briefed at the same time.
- If call load allows, sit up on the house and see if he goes mobile. Have a plan in place if he does and agree to an amount of time that you are willing to invest in waiting.
- Otherwise, surround and call out. Call his phone; do not approach the front of the house yet; remain in positions of cover.
- Before you call him, have an arrest plan and team in place, behind cover and concealment. Plan before you execute!
- If he comes out, your plan will work.
- If he does not come out, do not go in. Too many Texas peace officers have died going in after people with warrants. They come to us, or we wait to catch them another day and in another way.
- Absent positive identification that he is inside, if you get no response, you will likely have to leave and resume surveillance.
- If you have confirmed he is inside, treat as a barricade and implement your 5 C's:
- Contain | Control | Communicate | Call SWAT and CNT | Create a Plan

Deputy Constable Ruben Garcia EOW – 09/30/2024



Deputy Constable Ruben Garcia was killed in a vehicle crash after assisting other officers at a crash scene on Texas State Highway 48 near Marine Way Road at 6:45p.m.

Deputy Garcia was sitting in his parked patrol vehicle on the side of the highway, preparing to drive away, when he was rear-ended by a truck. He was transported to a Brownville hospital where he succumbed to his injuries.

The driver was on his phone when he collided with Deputy Garcia's patrol car. He was taken to the hospital with non-life-threatening injuries and was charged with intoxication manslaughter, causing death to a police officer.

Deputy Garcia had served with the Cameron County Constable's Office - Precinct 1 for over a year and previously served with the Cameron County Sheriff's Office for 22 years. He is survived by his wife, two sons, and a daughter.

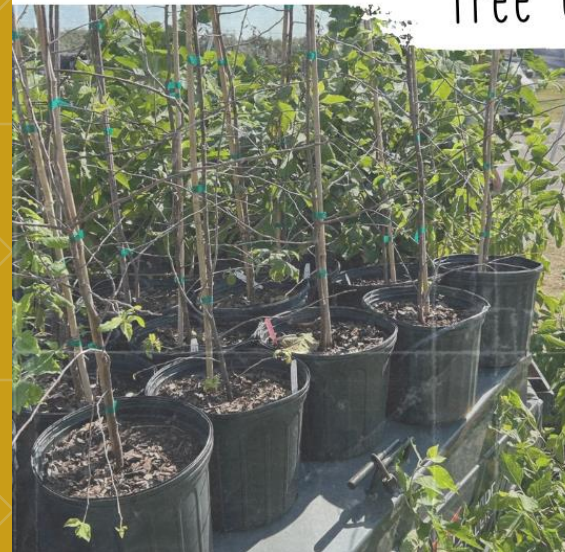

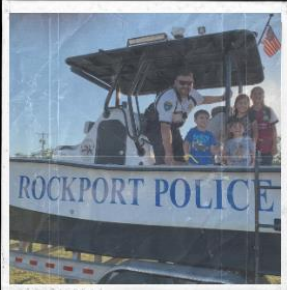

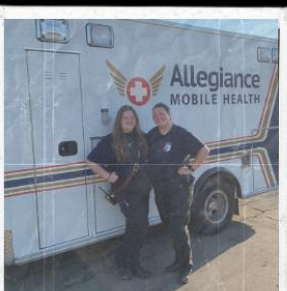
